## Patient Instructions Stool Collection Using Plastic Stool Cup for Stool Culture or Clostridium Difficile (C Diff)

Labeling of the specimen, to include name, d.o.b., collection date, time started, and time ended, is required to ensure prompt testing and to eliminate rejection by the laboratory.

## **Specimen Collection:**

- Wash your hands.
- Take the lid off the plastic lab container.
- Collect the stool in a bedpan or a clean margarine container.
- Do not contaminate the specimen with any urine. Urine may kill off the bacteria in the stool.
- When the specimen is obtained for a **Clostridium Difficile (C.Diff)** pour it into the plastic collection container and tightly replace the lid.
- When specimen is being obtained for a **Stool Culture** use an Orange-Capped Transport Vial following direction on the container itself.

## Do not scoop the specimen from the toilet.

- Using and ink pen or marker, print your first and last names, date of birth and the date and time the urine was collected (example: Nov 11, 2003 at 8:00 am) on the label.
- Place sample cup and/or vial in the zip lock specimen bag.
- Wash your hands again to avoid the spread of an infection.
- The Orange Capped Culture Vial is kept at **room temperature** and is **stable** for **48** hours.
- The Clostridium Difficile (C.Diff) specimen is kept refrigerated and should be brought to the lab within 24 hours.

**Note:** If stool for Ova & Parasites (O&P) are also being collected, the culture specimen should be collected with the last O&P sample. All vials can then be returned at the same time.
